Election Day Thoughts

Baptists are the most liberty-loving religious group in the world. We are a radically democratic, one person, one vote, kind of people. We organize our religious life around the idea that each individual is both free and responsible before God without any intermediary—not the church, not the pastor, and not any overarching religious authority. We take individual freedom and liberty seriously as a component of our faith, and we live it out inside our church polity.

We believe the best way for the Kingdom of God to flourish here on earth is through a free church in a free state. On the free church side, we consider religious liberty, the separation of church and state, local church autonomy, and the freedom of the individual conscience to be bedrock Baptist principles. On the free state side, we take our responsibilities as citizens with an equal amount of seriousness. We believe the individual freedom and liberty we exercise inside our church is equally important to the healthy functioning of a free state as well.

On this Election Day, I'm proud of our congregation. We are, I believe, by and large, holding up our Christian, Baptist responsibility to be engaged and informed citizens, and we are blessed to have more than our fair share of public servants and elected representatives as members of our church. The Baptist ideal of a free church in a free state requires careful safeguarding and constant vigilance from each of us, both as good Christians and as good citizens.

So, remember that voting today isn't only a right, it's also a sacred responsibility—and that independence, individual liberty, and freedom are not just hallmarks of our country, they are hallmarks of our Baptist faith, too.
